twenty fourth day of January in the year of our Lord God one thousand six hundred and

seventy two in the Ship called the Birgh of Stand all stode in the Dominion of his

Majesty of the King of Swedden. Which said Ship was afterwards to wit the eighteenth day of

February in the said year one thousand six hundred and seventy two and now last past

by a Court of admiralty held at Mammahowkes neck Within the said Province before the

President of the said Court of admiralty and his assistants adjudged and Condemned, to be

forfeited for Breach of the act of Parliament made at Westminster in the fifteenth year

of his Majesties King Charles the second King of England Scotland France & Ireland Defender

of the faith &c: and by the said Court of Admiralty Lawfully condemned and forfeited, according

to the said act of Parliament and thid the said Sander Sanders John Corneliffan Claus Jacobson

Jacob Peterson Lawrence Johnson Jurian Clauffon Swann and son Peter Helder Alexander

Mannys Sander Sanderson Jacob Koefson Claus Peterson George Colleston Christian

Hanson being Mariners and Sailors belonging to, and sailing the said Ship and now being desirous

to returne to their owne Country by way of England having in these parts no probability

of obtaining any other passage then that way, and having gotten passage in the good Ship

called the Goldenflew of Maryland now Ridding at anchor in Wicconico Bay Within

this Province of Maryland whereof George Edger is command: and bound for Newcastle in the

Kingdom of England, and having desired from me a licence and passport to depart from

hence in the said Ship to the said Port of Newcastle for the intent and purpose aforesaid
