WASHINGTON LETTER The Foreign Debt

come a law in the not distant future. and the Secretary of the Treasury will take up the negotiations with the debtor countries, subject to the limitations that Congress throws about his actions. There should be no great difficulty in arriving at agreements that will be satisfacte both to the United States and each of the debtor nations. Interest is now accruing on the certificates of indebtedness held in the Treasury at the rate of 5 per cent. There would seem to be no good reason why this country should not reduce that rate to 41-4 per cent, which is the average rate paid on Liberty I.
