The demands of justice are, however, infinite; vengeance is proverbially insatiable, and its reckonings can know no bounds but those of space and time. There is satisfaction yet to be made, and which the Southern States, ravaged, desoluted, and ruined as they are, have not made, and, indeed, are hardly in a condition to make with due solemnity. Till some millions that number, have humbled themselves in the dust before Mr. Sumner, and confessed themselves knowingly, purposely, deliberately and utterly in the wrong, and prepared to make corresponding restitution, he feels he has not ail that his cause justly entitles him to. THE RELIGIOUS REUNION MANIFESTA-Tions .- The reunion demonstrations between the Old and New School Presbyterian General Assemblies, in session in Philadelphia, are of interest not only to those denominations particularly, but to the public in general, on account of the disposition manifested among some leading divines for reunion with the Presbyterians of the South. The late correspondence between the Northern and Southern Bishops of the Methodist Church, while not warranting much hope of a speedy coming together of those churches, evinces mevertheless, an appreciation by both of the value of union. Whilst the chief significance to the public in these movements is in their indications of a more fraternal feeling between the people of the two sections, it is possible that the increasing desire for unity which has been gaining strength of late among all religious denominations may have something to do with it. But unity in organization, unless accompanied by a mutual confidence. would be a body without a spirit, and it is only so far as the outward and visible sign represents the principle of life within, that it is attractive and desirable. The disruption of most of the religious denominations before the war was the result of the alienated affections of the people of the two sections, and if we may regard the tendency to reunion now as the result of a disposition for reconciliation and fratermity, both the patriot and the Christian will have reason for congratulation.
