Jr., State Comptroller. From January 1 to June 30 last 107,-953,792.25 gallons of gasoline were used in the State, compared to 98,538,760.25 gallons between January 1 and June 30, 1935. The increase averaged 1,569,172

gallons monthly. The average monthly consumption this year was 17,992,298.70 gallons.
