## \$223,000 TO ORPHANS

It is pleasant to chronicle the fact that Col. E. R. Bradley, the only horseman who ever sent to the post four winners of the Kentucky Derby, has placed in the mails checks for a total of \$10,000 to provide Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners for the orphans of Kentucky. We understand that this year's contribution will bring to \$223,000 the amount that this sportsman has given to Kentucky orphans since 1921.






