"Green stuff is rich in vitamin A in the spring when chicks are small," he says, "but as the pullet grows older and its vitamin A needs increase, the hot summer sun burns up the green stuff and reduces its vitamin A content greatly. Science has put Pur-a-tene in the growing ration to overcome this and give pullets the vitamin A they really need."






