



The following board of directions. tors was unanimously elected: Hon. James A. Pearce, president; Hope H. Barroll, vice-president; Wilbur W. Hubbard, Garrett Foxwell, Adam F. Huey, T. Benj. Durding, D. Thos. Hurlock, Geo. D. Lofland, W. B. Copper. Mr. Geo. D. Lofland was elected a director to succeed H. W. Vickers, Sr., Esq., who resigned on account of the condi-

tion of his health. The Second National Bank charter will expire May 5th, and the Third National Bank will be launched with most flattering prospects. The capital stock of the new bank will be \$50,000 divided into 500 shares of \$100 each.
