Be it enacted, &c. that every person who shall deal in the selling of any goods, wares or merchandize, except such as are of the growth, produce, or manufacture of the United States, and except such as are sold by the Importer thereof in the original Cask, Case, Box, or Package herein the same shall have been imported, shall be deemed to be. and hereby is declared to be, a retail dealer in merchandize within the meaning of this act."

It is hoped that after this plain exposition of the Law, its provisions will be promptly complied with.
