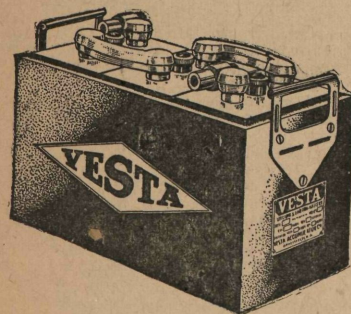

SNAPSHOTS OF NEWS

Serbian forces have occupied Alessio and the Valley of the Drin, Albania, thereby surrounding Scutari and cutting its communications with Durrazo and Tirana.
Alvices from Teheran report that Persian government troops have established contact with Bolshevik forces between Menjil and Kazvin, northwest of Teheran.
Reassessment of Frederick county on a higher tax basis has been finally ordered by the State Tax Commission in spite of the opposition of the County Commissioners.
A mob was thwarted in an attempt at Lynchburg to take Robert Williams, a negro, charged with criminally assaulting Miss Annie Lynch, from jail to Lynch him.
Nearly 50 missionary workers of the Southern Baptist Church, including Robert Lord Bancum, of Baltimore, sailed from Vancouver for Japan, China and Africa.
Terrence MacSweeney, lord mayor of Cork, and 10 men who were arrested with him last Thursday night, have refused food since they were placed in a military barracks.
Soviet Russia, it is said, intends to seek an alliance with Germany to make war on France, and if this is successful, to undertake a conquest of England and eventually America.
Peddlers selling sugar at 19 cents a pound—which is four or five cents cheaper than grocery store prices—were nearly rushed off their feet by

women buyers in Brooklyn's eastern district.
The North Carolina Senate decided to postpone action on the suffrage amendment until the regular session of the legislature. The Tennessee House adjourned without taking a vote on the question.
Louis A. Cerf, New York manager of the Metropolitan Mutual Benefit Life Insurance Company, who had been reported missing, was found in a hospital suffering from a possible fracture of the skull.
The American Civil Liberties Union announced in New York the creation of a national ball fund of \$300,000, to be used in an effort to effect the release of "hundreds of political prisoners held for trial or imprisoned during appeal after conviction."

Adam B. Howard, general manager in South America, who disappeared during the voyage of the steamship Martha Washington, is believed by the ship's officers to have leaped overboard as he said he intended to commit suicide.
Free radium treatment for sufferers from cancer will be administered beginning October 15 by the New York State Institution for the Study of Malignant Diseases at Buffalo.
Colonel Leedy closed his campaign for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the Sixth Virginia district with a speech at Luray, attacking his rival, Congressman Harrison.

The council of the League of Nations at San Sebastian considered the repatriation of the 200,000 European prisoners of war still held in Russia and the 160,000 Russians in German military prisons.

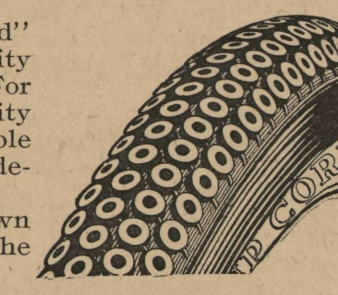

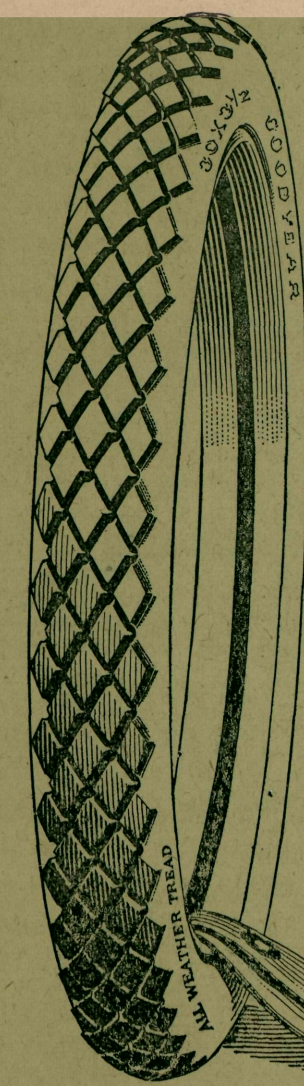
