In 1931 Major Wallace was selected to command the first Marine Corps squadron to serve aboard a Naval Aircraft squadron he had the distinction of being the first Marine aviator to land aboard a carrier at night as well as in the day time.

In 1932 the plane which Major Wallace was piloting caught fire during a gunner flight and he was forced to jump, thus becoming a member of the famed Caterpiller Club whose one quallife must have been saved by a parachute when a plane went wrong. The Major landed in the Pacific Ocean about five miles from land. Although badly burned, Major Wallace managed to stay afloat until picked up by a nearby naval vessel.




