A special feature of the program was the splendid work of the school glee club which has made rapid strides during the past year.

Among the speakers were Charles I. Boyle, representing the Board of Commissioners, Franklin D. Day, Superinof Queen Anne's County and Brady J. Dayton, of the Walter J. Huffington, State Supervisor of Colored Schools.

The school was recently completed as a Works Progress Project through the hearty cooperation of the Board of Education and the Board of County Commissioners at a cost of \$24,619.02. 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
