

Oeufs en Croutes or Eggs in Crusts

Novel foreign dishes always seem to increase the popularity of the hostess. A woman who gets the reputation of serving fine novel dishes will always find people ready and anxious for an invitation to her home. Here is a dish to try the next time you are serving novel foreign dishes:

OEUFS EN CROUTES (Eggs in Crusts)

4 round rolls (hard)

¼ cup butter

1 teaspoon cooked sweet pepper pulp,

Cut a slice from the top of each roll, and scoop out the insides, from the lower part. Cream the butter and mix with one teaspoon of cooked sweet pepper pulp, strained. Spread this over the cavity in each roll, then dip the whole very quickly in boiling stock. 
