On this 17 day of June, 1890, at Baltimore, County of City

State of Md, before me, J. J. S. Conroy, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Thomas E. Down

who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: I am, about 56 years of age Residence 735 Jew Alley, this city.

Laborn,

Enlisted I think June 14, 1864 and served in Co. K, 19th U.S.C. T.I., to muster out.

Saw claimant in the regiment and while in service.

Know nothing about his being sick or disabled in service.

Next saw him some 10 or 12 years after discharge, soon after this he complained of effects of wounds, and injuries incurred

July 30, 1864, in front of Petersburg Va. and said he had pain in his left hip & pain in his limbs. He walked with a cane and evidently suffered as he stated and has been getting worse each year as he grows older.

Affidavit read to & acknowledged by deponent.

Have known claimant ever since we were discharged, but saw very little of him until 10 or 12 years ago, and know he has been lame & used a stick for the last 10 or 12 years. Not retated or interested, questions understood answers correctly recorded.
