Vincent Demby, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 55 years

of age. reside 632 Sarah Ann st.

occupation laborer. I was born in

Queen Anns Co Ma near Queenstown.

I was slave born I lived there to the

time I went into the army. I enlisted in Co C 7th USCT here in this
city in the fall of 1863 and served till
after the fall of Richmond. my discharge
from this service has been lost.

This was my only service in the U. S. Army
or U. S. Navy. I got wounded at the
battle of Ft. Mifflin front of Richmond and
lost the thumb on the right hand and was
shot through the arm above the elbow. & because
of this, I was discharged before the Regiment
was. My Captain was named Wise & was
with the company most of the time. Chaney
was our Lieutenant, & also Lt Eiler.

I applied for pension under the general law
with Atty Colton here in this city. My witnesses
to identity were Nehemiah Demby he is now
living. I cant now recall the other one.

I received a pension under this law at rate
of \$4 per month. I made an application
under the New law with S. L. Stanton &
under this law I received a pension
