The State of all Maryland to all persons
to whom these presents shall come
greeting. Know ye that upon the ninth
day of April Anno Domini 1794 before
James Price Register of Wills for Talbot County duly thereto
constituted & appointed the last Will & Testament of
Ann Dilghman late of Talbot County deceased, was in
common form of law proved & approved & Exhibited a copy
whereof is to these presents annexed And whereas
the said Ann Dilghman the Testatrix did by her
Will appoint Richard Dilghman 4th and Lloyd Dilgh-
man the Executors of the said valid Testament and last Will
and did also by the said Testament & last Will expressly
order and direct that no appraisement should be made
of her the said Testatrix's personal Estate & as by the
said Testament & last Will may appear And whereas
it is suggested by the said Richard Dilghman 4th and Lloyd
Dilghman the Executors aforesaid that the said Ann
Dilghman the Testatrix had & hath a considerable personal
Estate in the State of Maryland consisting of Goods Chattels
Debts & Credits which if speedy care be not taken for
the security thereof may be totally lost And whereas the
said Testatrix put implicit Faith & Confidence in the said Executors
in & by ^{her} said last Will named that they would faithfully execute
the same according to Law & the Intention of the said Testatrix
We do therefore hereby request Depute & authorize you the
said Richard Dilghman 4th & Lloyd Dilghman to secure
and collect the Estate of the said Ann ^{Dilghman} ~~Richard Dilghman~~
the Testatrix whether it may be goods or Chattels Debts
or Credits wheresoever the same are or may be in
the State of Maryland and the same when secured to
distribute according to the Will of the said Testatrix & the
