

Of the Horses the arabians
have two great branches,
the Kadichis, whose descent
is unknown, and the Koch-
-lani, of which a written
genealogy has been kept
for 2000 years.

The Kadichis are in no
higher estimation than our
common European horses
and are used as beasts of
burden, but the Kochlani
are employed solely for
riding, and are highly es-
-timated. They are said to
derive their origin
from King Solomon's
studs; and are certainly
animals of great mettle
and perseverance. They are
