He was always sensible when talking to me.

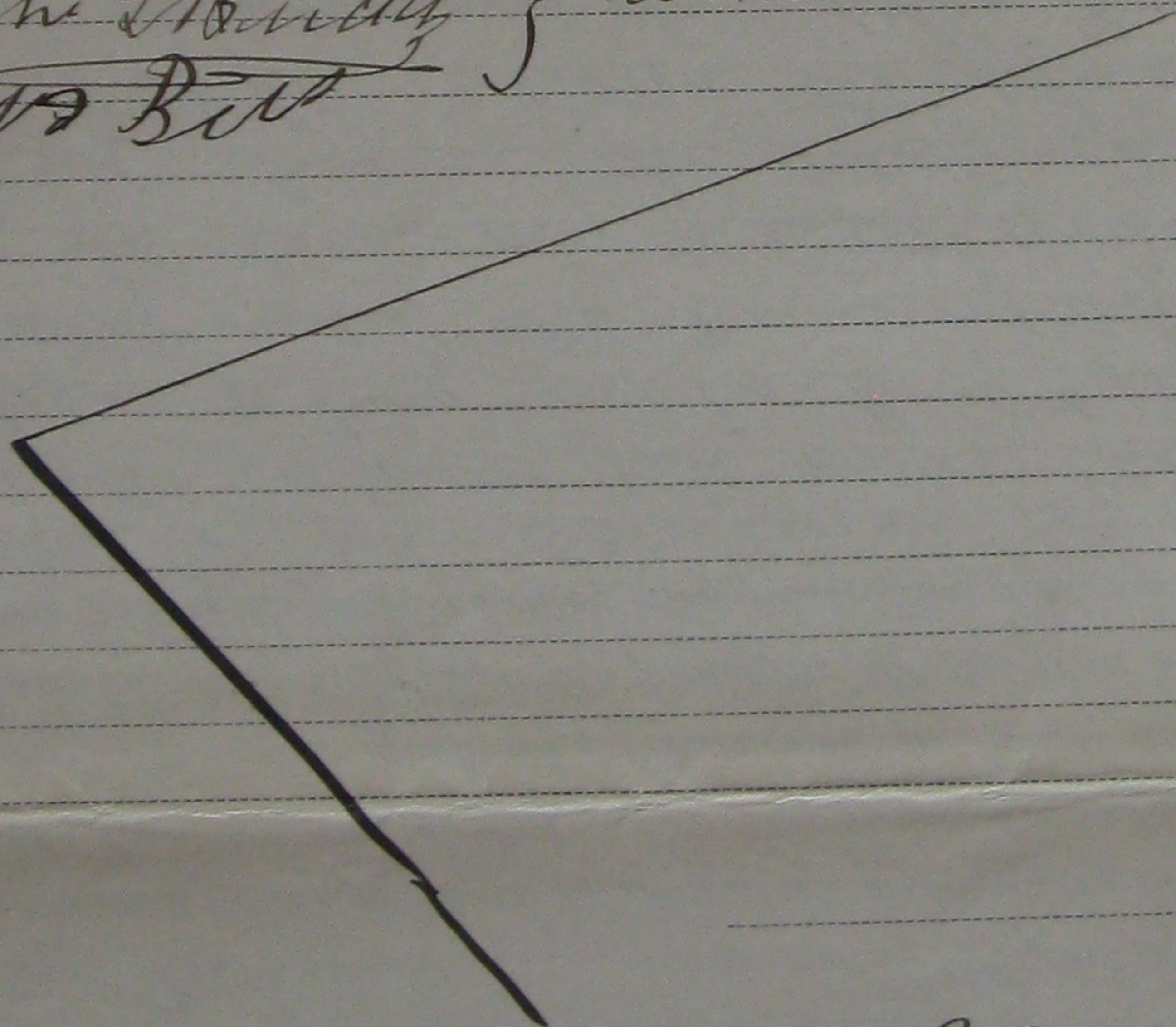
If he is crazy now I do not know of anything that happened in the war to cause it.
