

DEPOSITION

Case of Joseph Shipley Insane No. 913387

On this 3^d day of October, 1898, at Camden, county of Camden, State of N.J., before me, R. M. Morris, a special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared Horace Price, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says: That he is age 52 years; post-office address, 1114 So 6th St Camden N.J.; occupation, laborer

I served in Co K 9th U.S.C.T. and knew Joseph Shipley Orderly Sergeant of the Company.

I did not know him previous to my enlistment, but I knew him during his whole service. I was a private and Corporal.

I saw him two or three times after my discharge in Decr 1866. The last time I saw him he was in an Insane Asylum in West Baltimore Md. I was employed by a man who had a deranged son in said Asylum, and I occasionally drove my employer's wife to see her son, and when I saw Joseph Shipley, they had him out walking for exercise, and I recognized him and shook him by the hand, and I talked with him and he talked with me, but at random. I don't know how long he had been insane nor do I know the cause.
