

times after 1866 and before the time I saw him in an Asylum he appeared to be all right. I then talked with him and noticed nothing wrong.

I never knew him to have any disability during his service. There was nothing at all about him during his service to indicate that his mental condition was in any way affected. I don't recall any sun stroke, or wound or injury of head.

I may have heard him complain of his head during his service but I don't recollect it now. I never in the army thought him insane.

I answered the Bureau letter, or had my son write it for me.

My son must have put that in about Shipley complaining of his head, but now I am under oath and I cannot say I remember any complaints about his head.

My answers are correctly recorded.
