

most of the time under confinement and has been since 1874 in the same institution. On a personal interview with George R. Gaither, a capitalist, who owned some of this family before the war, one a cousin of this soldier, by the same name, of Joseph Shipley, who was only 12 years of age at the 1861, is also insane and under confinement - he was sure it was this soldier, but on further inquiry, I found he was by another father, a brother, by name of William Shipley. This was the only evidence I could obtain of any insanity in the family before service.

In view of the lack of evidence to show service - origin of insanity I would recommend the case for rejection - lest there should be an injustice shown, further examination should be continued on the list as follows.
