The requiring should have been Harris & not Harrison. (B.J. 9) The statements made in that affidavit about my seeing signs of ~~affo~~ weakening of Soldier's mind in the service while at Brownsville Texas ^{is wrong} I don't now remember ever seeing any signs of it while in the army.

He always performed his duties, so far as I could see all right and no sign of his being crazy at that time was noticed by me.
