Tuesday	SE	E		<p>At 12 P.M. the Admiral ordered below voice several Prigs & vessels of War & Transports in Pt. St. Johns & several Transports at Anchor in Namond Rock Bay. At 1st P.M. Pass de fire W. lying too off Pt Solomon Bay at 4 Shortened sail & anchored under Pt Solomon in 24 fms Pt Solomon 1/2 to 3 miles out all Boats & sent the Marines & a party of Sailors to a Bar near Pigeon Island to erect Batteries. At 5 P.M. Water 1/2 fms at 12 P.M. Remains 128 Tons</p>
Wednesday	SE	W		<p>Mid to Pass to fire W. at 4 P.M. weighed & tacked 1 Cable length nearer the Shore anchored again in 10 fms Pt Solomon 1/2 to 3 miles carried a Hedge out to the SW at 8 P.M. Genl Shipley began throwing Shells from a 43 Inch Mortar to Pigeon Island at 12 P.M. the Bomb Squadron & several transports under weigh. Marines & a Party of Seamen on Shore. At 1 P.M. Pass de Cloudy W. with rain at times. At 1 P.M. Genl Shipley & Capt. R. D. (old) was mortally wounded on shore by a Shell from Pigeon Island & afterwards exposed on Board at 4 P.M. Marines & a Party of Seamen on shore emp'd carrying Ammunition & Mining tools to the Batteries. At 1 P.M. Neptune Anch. outside of us.</p>
