BRUCE ELECTION SEEMS ASSURED

ENTHUSIASM FOR CANDIDATE ON TRIP—FRANCE WORKERS ARE DISCOURAGED.

With the campaign of William Cabell Bruce, Democratic nominee for the United States Senate, practically at a close, a sum-up of the situation would indicate his election by a sweeping majority if the voters carry out their promise to go to the polls on Tuesday, November 7, and vote to restore Maryland's prestige in the Senate.

The tour of the State of Mr. Bruce and the similar trip of Senator France have been in sharp contrast. Mr. Bruce has been received on every hand by gatherings of the most representative citizens of the communities he visited, and the promises of support have been so spontaneous that there can be no doubt that, not only will the Democratic registered vote come out in force for him on election day, but that a record vote of Independent and Republican men and women will be cast for Mr. Bruce.

One of the most striking facts of the campaign has been that Mr. Bruce, no matter what section of the State in which he stood at the time, has been entirely consistent with his past record of constructive accomplishments, with the declarations of his party platform, and with his own "creed" as laid down in his address of acceptance.

In sharp contrast is the course of Senator France. In one section of the State he blows one way, and in another section of the State he blows another. While true of practically all his policies, there could be no better illustration than his various stands on Bolshevism, and those theories of red-socialism which threaten the very foundations of the Republic.

Another remarkable condition of the present campaign is the practically unanimous view of the press of Maryland, and it may be said of the press of the nation, that Senator France is not fit to longer hold the post of United States Senator. He has been denounced on every side as an obstructionist, as a blatant demagogue, as a man who has cost his state dear in both reputation and in federal appropriations, and whose advocacy of Bolshevism thought on the floor of the United States Senate has given encouragement to that group of extreme foreign radicals who live upon our shores, but who have never assimilated American ideals, and who are constantly plotting against the government.

HOW KENT OYSTER GETS ITS FIRST START

Does Great Part in Helping to Free Maryland, And Other States, Too.

The habits of the oyster, the growth and sale of which form a big item in the business life of Kent county, is a most interesting story. Millions of oysters produced right here in Kent waters go to all parts of the country and into Canada.

The very beginning of the oyster is the eggs of the female, which float on top of the water, about 40,000,000 of them in a bunch, and when they meet with the male eggs, as is the case with the eggs of fish, the natural function is completed. However, a very small percentage of the female eggs are fertilized.

There is where stream pollution does its great work. Oil is deadly to the youngster; but if he passes through this danger to his existence, pretty soon his shell begins to form and weight him down.

In the days when there were plenty of oysters the newly arrived youngster grabbed the nearest oyster and added another to the cluster. 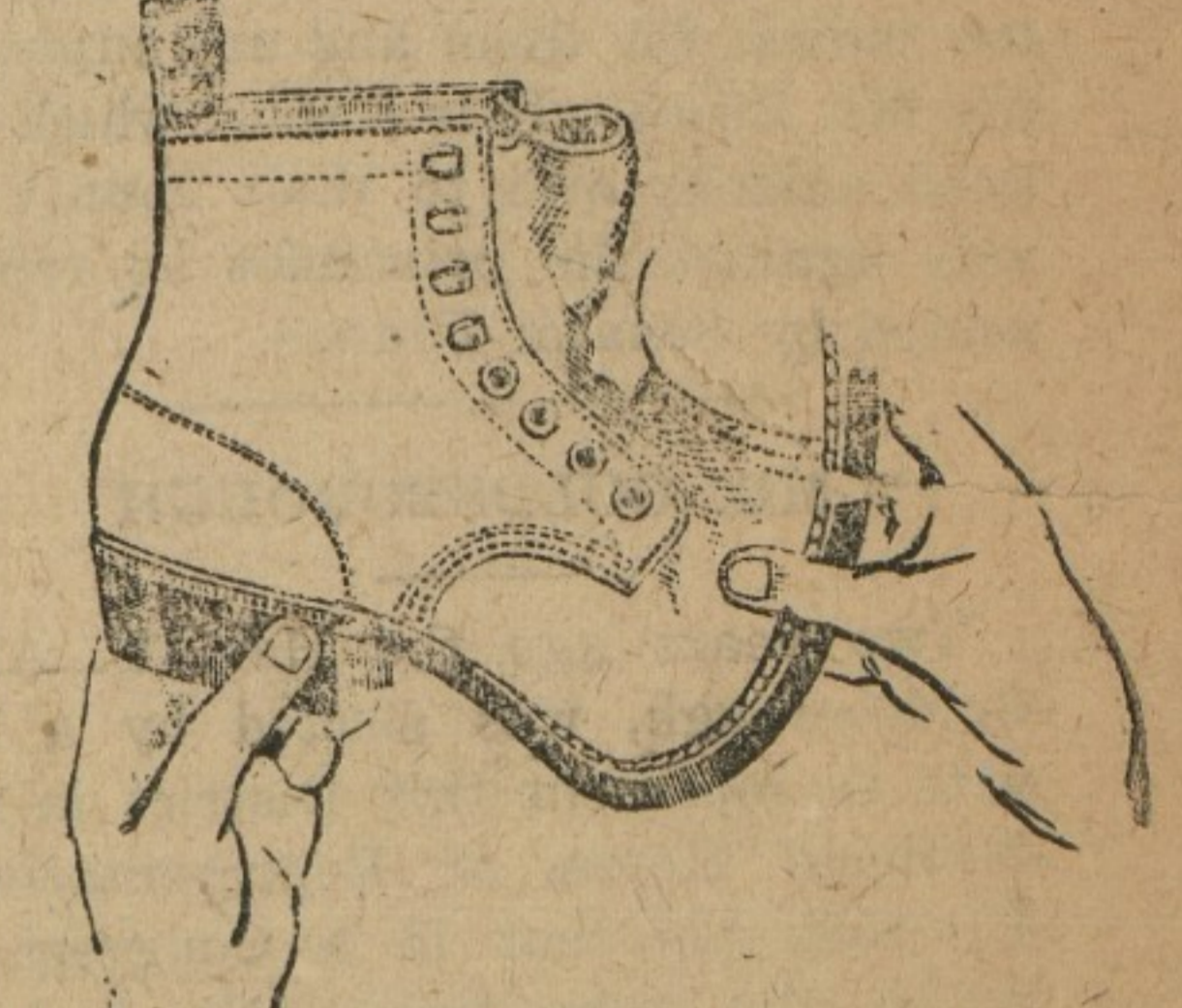
