

QUEEN ANNE'S INCREASE 5C.

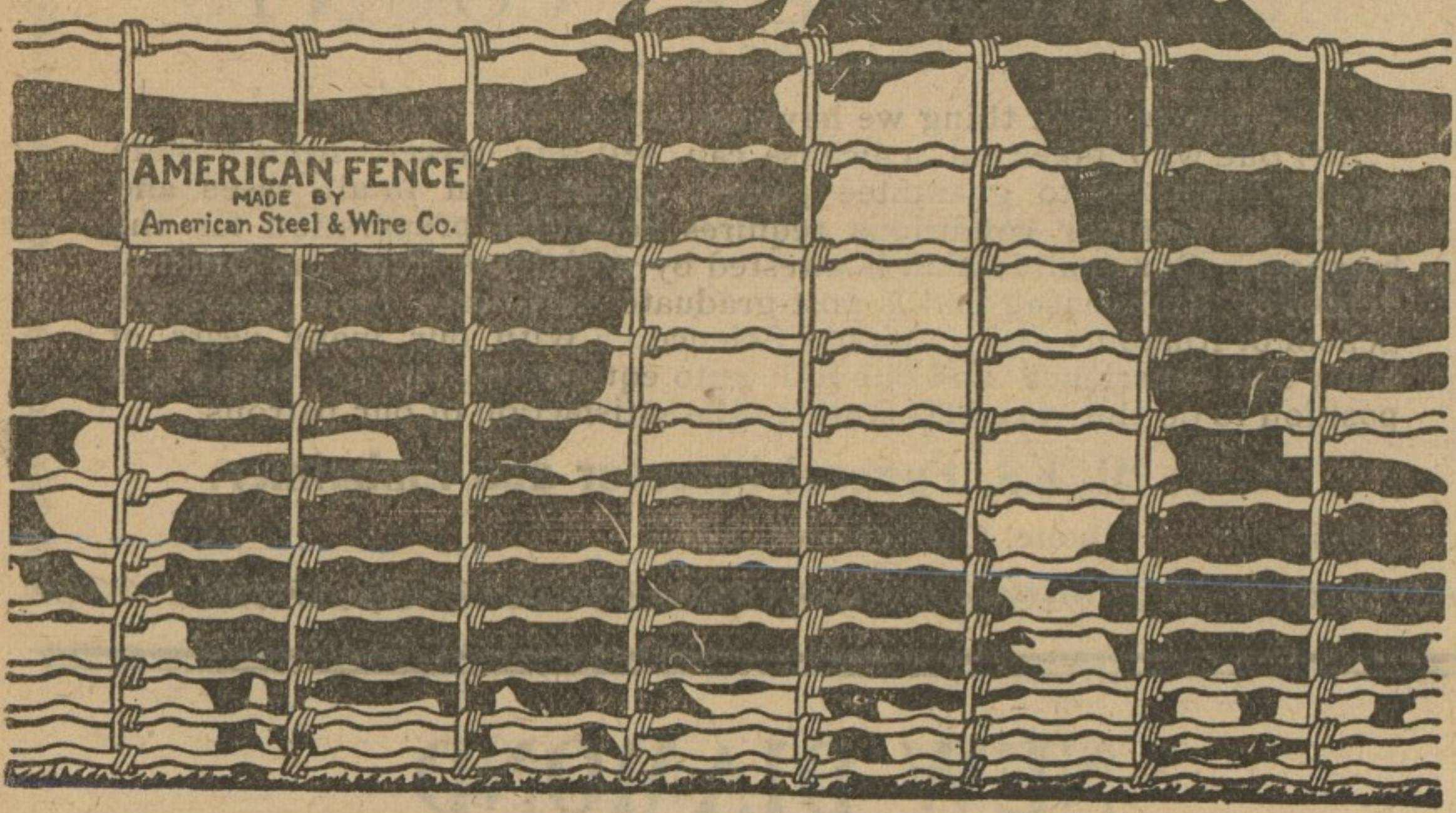
At a meeting of the Board of County Commissioners for Queen Anne's, it was voted to increase the tax rate of Queen Anne's county five cents, making the rate \$1.47.

But recently the county lost \$384,000 of its taxable basis by an abatement to the M. D. & V. R. R. on its boating stock.

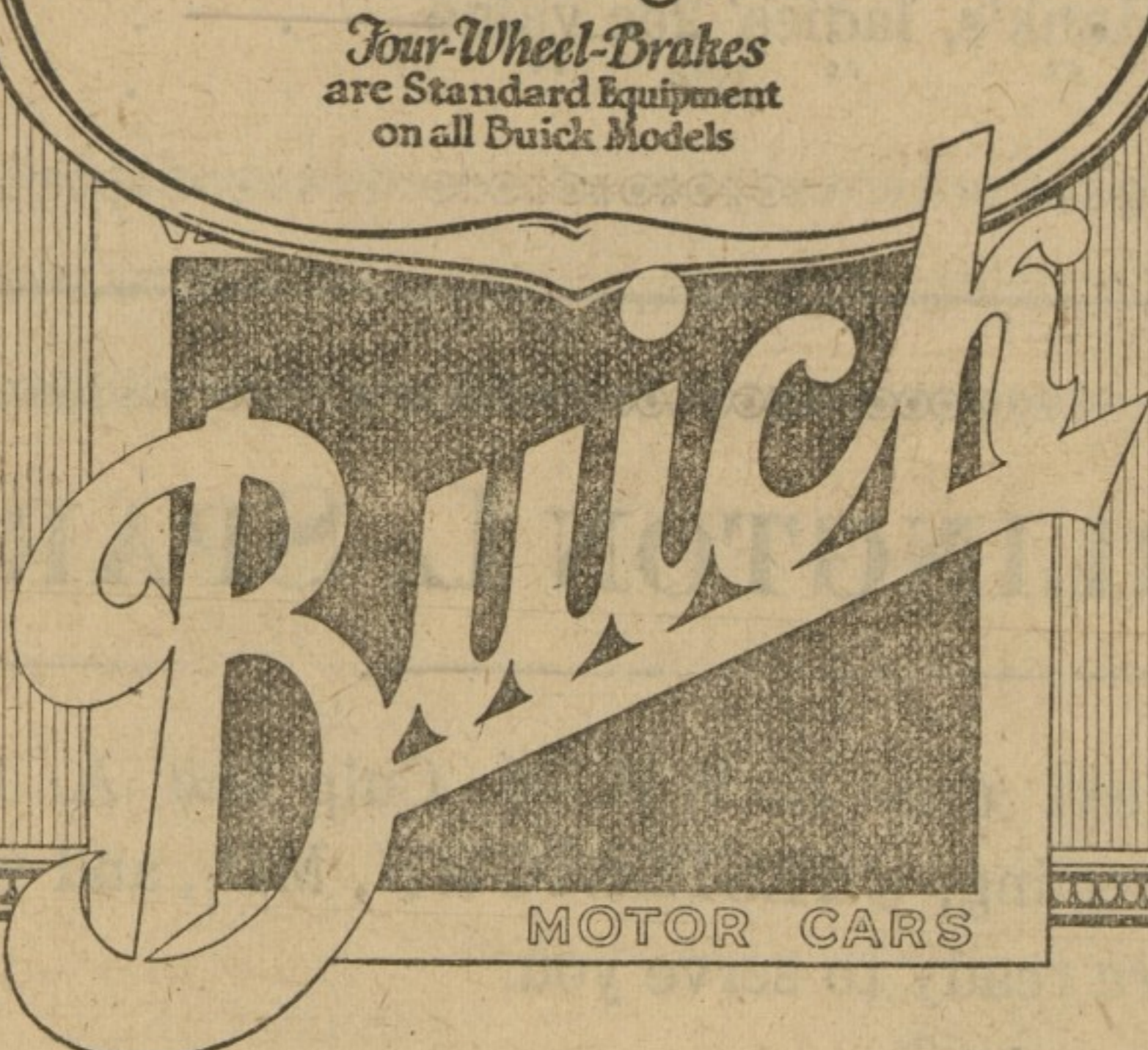

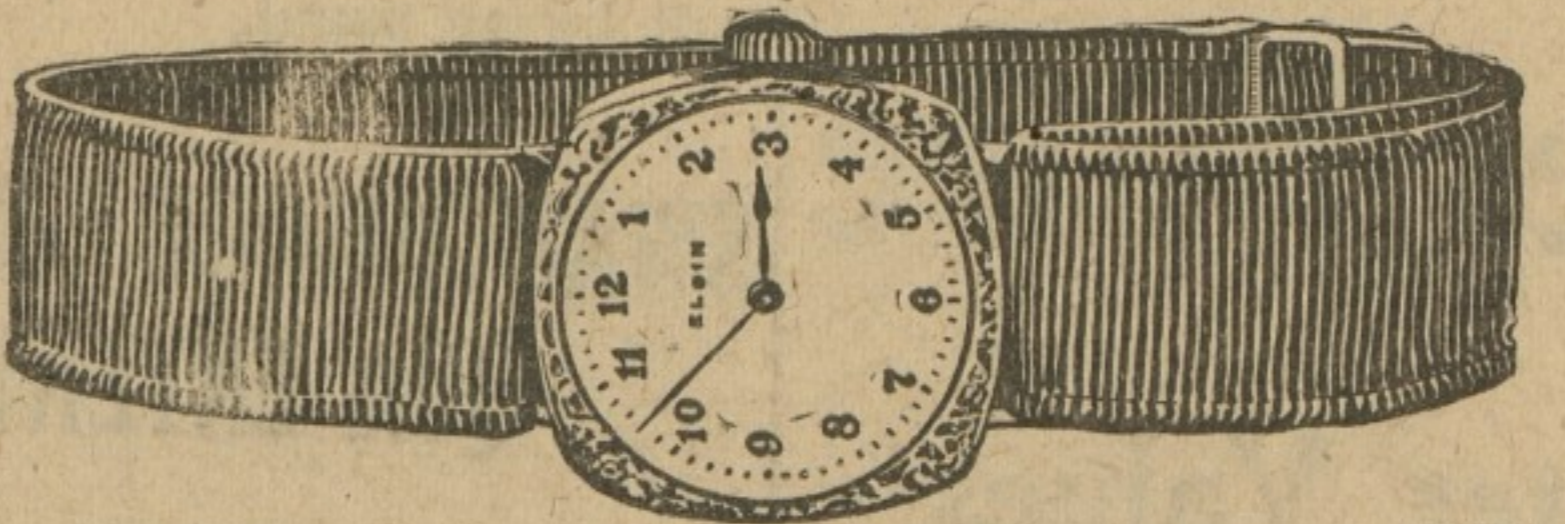
