### Urged to Form Rotary Club

Presenting a strong plea for the formation of a rotary club in Chestertown to cooperate with the Delmarva Eastern Shore Association in boosting the Eastern Shore, John Terrill, president of the Elkton Rotary Club, Monday night addressed a company of business men here on rotary and its benefits. Accompanying the Cecil county rotarian were Messrs. Keppeler, Terrill, Gillespie and Moore, all prominent professional men of Elkton. President Paul Titsworth, of Washington College, presided at the party which was attended by Harry F. Jefferson, Donald F. Stam, Richard H. Collins, Jr., Dr. H. G. Simpers, W. Robert Huey, William B. Usilton, Charles Kibler, Charles L. Dodd, Dr. J. P. Franklin, William B. Wilmer, Hope B. Hudson, Marion deK. Smith, Conlyn Noland, Austin F. Shure, Sidney Turner, Clinton Jones, James G. Metcalfe. These men constitute the nucleus of a rotary club now in process of formation. It is expected a charter will be granted by the national body within the next month. At the same time the directors of the business men's association held a meeting and decided to organize a county-wide Chamber of Commerce the activities of which, it is expected, will embrace all towns and rural communities in Kent.

These two organizations, now about to be formed, will work closely with the Delmarva association in Salisbury to advertise the resources of the fourteen counties of the peninsula. Dr. Paul E. Titsworth has been chosen president of the projected rotary club, W. R. Huey, secretary.

### Their Own Ballots Deprive Women of Vestry Membership

That the women of Chester parish at least are averse to holding official positions in the parish was evidenced at the annual meeting, held in Emmanuel Protestant Episcopal Church, when the right to become members of the vestry was defeated.

A majority of the women members present voted strongly against the proposition, while a large proportion of the male members voted favorably.

The Episcopal convention some years ago gave parishes the right to admit women to the vestries of the church by vote, but it is stated that in no instance on the Eastern Shore have the churches voted favorably. Women present at the meeting stated that the bulk of the work of the church devolves upon them, and it would seem selfishness to deprive the men of the privilege of controlling the vestry.

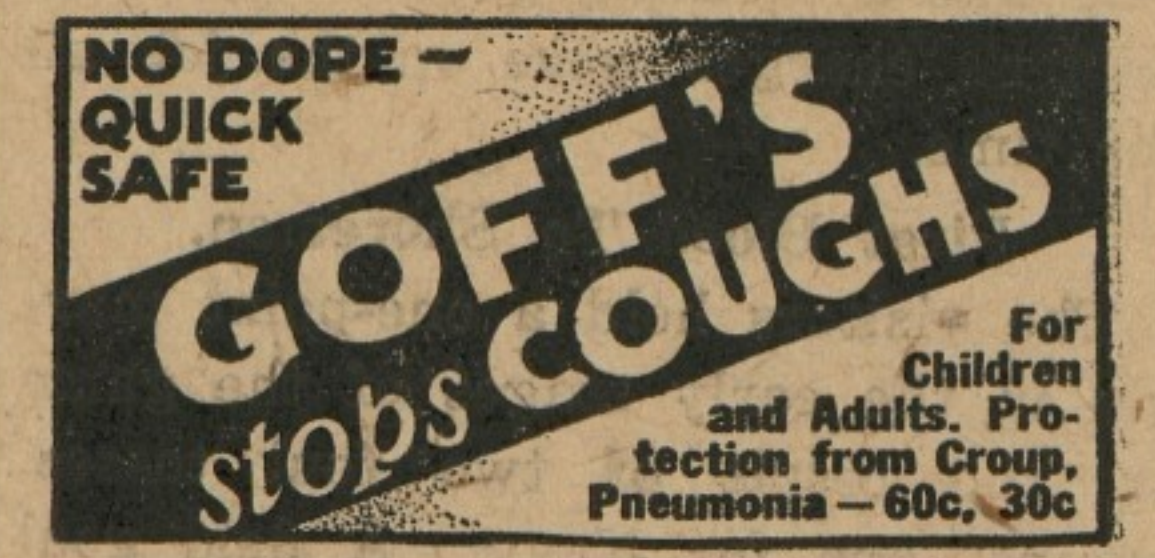
