"REVENGE" TRIUMPH FOR DOLORES DEL RIO

A gypsy romance of fire and passion, barbaric in its surging emotions, colorful as a Romany costume, lilting as a Roumanian rhapsody, glamorous with romantic charm, dynamic in its dramatic sweep—that is "Revenge" which comes to The New Lyceum on Thursday-Friday, Feb. 7th and 8th.

"Revenge" is one of the finest works of screen art that Hollywood has yet produced. It is another triumph for Dolores Del Rio, the star, for Edwin Carewe, the director, and for Finis Fox, the scenarist.

Beautiful in costumes of barbaric splendor, imperious in exercising her will over man and beast, tender in her romantic moments, Miss Del Rio's histrionic skill and gift of character delineation find opportunity for full expression as a gypsy girl who tames wild bears and men for the sheer joy of taming them.

In "Resurrection" and "Romana" she played a tragic role. In "Revenge" she is the essence of charm and fire as the adorable gypsy bear-tamer and even in her most dramatic nuances accentuates her performance with delightful humorous touches.

Edkin Carewe, the noted producer-director, has handled this United Artists photoplay in a masterly manner. He has caught the romantic spirit of gypsy life and has invested his picture with atmospheric charm and dramatic sincerity. No other director has ever been capable of getting out of Miss Del Rio such vivid characterization and depth of emotion.

Finis Fox has furnished a splendid screen adaptation, as he did in "Resurrection" and "Romana." His screen technique is modern, his continuity vivid and facile, and moves with intriguing interest.

A cast of brilliant players, supports Miss Del Rio. Leroy Mason as Jorga, the bandit, Rita Carewe, as a jealous gypsy girl, gives a finished performance that is human and sympathetic. Jose Crespo, as a young dreamer, and James Marcus, as the screen father of Miss Del Rio are entirely adequate.
