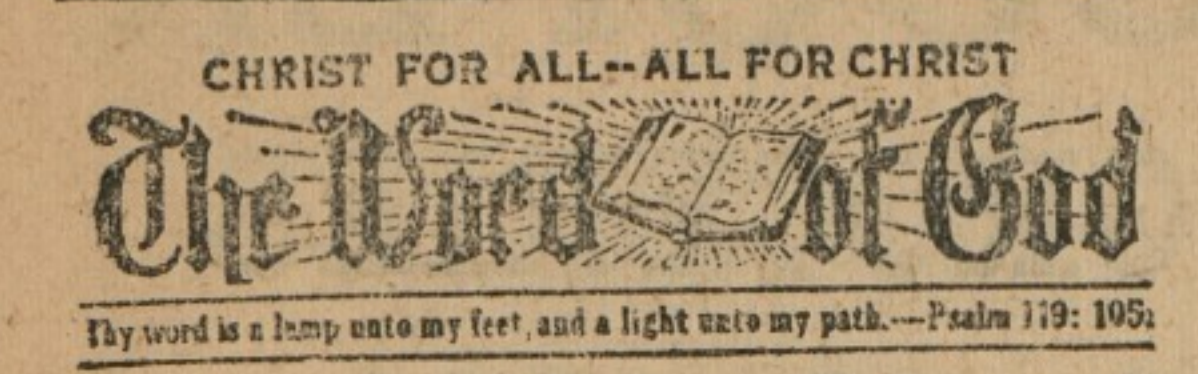


### CHURCH NOTES AROUND KENT

#### Egyptian Builders

An Egyptianologist says that the Egyptians set up tall obelisks, like Cleopatra's Needle, by building a temporary embankment with a deep pit in the middle, dragging the monument to the edge of the pit, and tipping it over to stand in place on firm ground.

#### Water "Fertilized"

"Water farmers" who raise fish, either for aquariums or for restocking the streams, are now using fertilizing materials in their ponds to increase and improve the vegetable matter upon which the fish feed.

### HOW EXCLAMATION "BY JIMINY" MAY HAVE ORIGINATED.

Two theories have been advanced to account for the origin of "Jiminy" or "Jimmie" in the sense of a mild oath, or an expletive or exclamation. One regards it as a corruption of "Jesu domine," the Latin for "Lord Jesus." The other holds that it is a corruption of "Geminus," the plural of Latin "geminus," meaning twin. "Geminus" was applied in Roman mythology to Castor and Pollux, the twin sons of Jupiter and Leda. It is the name of a constellation and the third sign of the zodiac, which is represented by the twin gods, Castor and Pollux, sitting side by side. To say "By Castor and Pollux" or "By Geminus"—by the twins—was to use a powerful oath in ancient Rome. The word is still sometimes written "Geminus" and "Gemin." It may be, however, that "by Jiminy" is of Teutonic origin, for it appears in various forms in German, Dutch and Scandinavian languages, and the oath and exclamation is generally used much more frequently by the people of those countries.—Exchange.

### How Defect in Carbon Causes Light to Flare

The Niagara Falls Chamber of Commerce says that the lights which illuminate Niagara falls are operated with a carbon arc which is automatically fed throughout the period of lighting. The carbon is good for about two hours and a half. During perfect operation there is no flare in the lamp, the carbon being perfectly adjusted and its content being pure. Under such conditions there is an intensive arc which is reflected from mirrors and condensed to establish the great amount of light given by one of these projectors. However, when the carbon is being fed toward the arc a slight imperfection or a small particle of foreign matter will cause a flare. This flare is only occasional. Probably there are few carbons that will not cause some flare, but the amount of flare seen depends upon the quality of the carbon used. With reference to the power of these lights, each arc runs from 80,000,000 to better than 100,000,000 candlepower, depending upon the adjustment of the rays. It is perfectly possible to step one of these lights up to 200,000,000 candlepower. The average amount of illumination which is secured from the entire battery is 1,440,000,000 candlepower.

### How Old Egyptians Wrote

The papyrus of the Egyptians was made of strips of the fruit of the papyrus plant arranged in layers. These were arranged in long rectangular sheets. The writer used a reed called kash with red or black ink, the formula for which is unknown today. At first the sheets were rolled and tied with a string; later they were bound together like the modern books. The rolls and sheets varied in dimensions. In many instances they reached a length of 144 feet. When newly prepared, papyrus was white. The papyrus that have come down to us are made brittle by age and are light or dark brown.

### How Echoes Steer Ships

The fathometer, an instrument that measures the depth of water by timing electric echoes, guided the Levitan across the Atlantic recently. This instrument enables the navigating officers to plot their course as accurately in darkness and fog as in daylight and clear weather.

It is particularly valuable when approaching land, where knowledge of depth is most important.

The fathometer transmits electric sounds downward from the keel. The time required for return of the echoes is timed to a split second and is translated in fathoms of depth on a clock-faced dial.

### How Tree Was Saved

Permission was given a business man of Upland, Calif., to cut down a stalwart old pine tree in front of his place of business because it obstructed his view. Just as the majestic monster, which had been growing in the same place before Upland was settled, toppled to the ground the radio in a shop across the street switched to another number on the program. The deep bass voice of a singer somewhere in the United States hurried this admonition to those who took the life of the tree: "Poems are made by fools like me; but only God can make a tree."

### How to Make False Onyx

An interesting method of making a false onyx is by soaking a banded chalcodony in dilute honey or sugar syrup, says Nature Magazine. The stone is then placed in hot concentrated sulphuric acid which chars the sugary material in the porous bands, leaving the white bands as they were originally. This dyeing is practiced mostly in Germany.

### How Saint Compromised

"When in Rome, do as the Romans do"—originated in this way. St. Augustine, puzzled because they fasted in Rome on Saturday, consulted St. Ambrose, who said, "When I am here (Milan) I do not fast on Saturday; when at Rome, I do fast on Saturday."

### Names Given Moons

The expression "harvest moon" occurs in English literature as early as 1708. In 1710 there is reference to the "hunter's moon."

### Raymers to Royalty

There seems to be no authentic record of the origin of "Poet-Laureate of England" but it is recorded that Richard Coeur de Lion had a "versificator regis," a development of the practice of earlier times, when minstrels and versifiers were part of the retinue of the king.

### Fiercer Than Shark

It is generally believed that the shark is the most dangerous, but the barracuda, a large savage pelliclike fish of the tropical seas, is more apt to attack man than the shark. It is almost as large as a twelve-year-old boy and its mouth is such that any bite is likely to result in permanent injury.

### Lighthouse Innovation

In 1824 an arc lamp was installed in a lighthouse at Dungeness, England, and supplied with current from a cumbersome magneto-electric machine. This was the first regular electric light in service.
