The original complaint is that
the Mayor & City Council, had cut thro the
hills and diverted the water of the open
stream from the Western to the Eastern
Cove, and thus injured the property on the
Eastern Cove. The object of opening some of
the streets was to divert the water from the
Hills Eastwardly. He then referred to the

1796 ch 68 transferred their
powers to City of Baltimore, and invested
the City authorities with powers to open and
grade streets, prevent nuisances, and provide
means for the navigation of the Harbor

1797 ch 54 sect 2, powers to
open and repair streets and ferries in the
said City

1817 ch 14 sect 7 grants power
empowering a person to prevent nuisances and
as to the acts for the general benefit of
the City not inconsistent with the rights of the
Citizens.
