Fred W. Friendly has spent virtually all his life in journalism: practicing it, shaping it, teaching it, and writing about it. With his partner, Edward R. Murrow, Mr. Friendly was responsible for many of television's most distinguished moments, including *See It Now* and *CBS Reports*. After serving as president of CBS News from 1964 to 1966, Mr. Friendly joined the Ford Foundation and was named the Edward R. Murrow Professor of Journalism at Columbia University. As communications advisor at the Foundation, he was the originating force behind the Media and Society Seminars, which created the television project "The Constitution: That Delicate Balance." Mr. Friendly has written several books, including *Minnesota Rag* and *The Good Guys, the Bad Guys and the First Amendment*.
