John Anderson died. 10 Minutes before  
4 o'clock in the evening on Sunday the  
14 December 1766 —

On the 17<sup>th</sup> Day of December Anno Domini 1766  
John Dickinson James Gray and Moses Allen the Witnesses  
to the nuncupative Will hereto annexed being duly and solemnly  
on the Holy Evangelis of Almighty God deposed and Said  
that they were present when the Testator John Anderson in  
his last sickness & in his own dwelling House. declared Word  
to the same Effect of the Instrument of Writing hereunto  
annexed signed by them which John Dickinson immediately  
reduced to writing & that the said Testator called John  
Dickinson to him & then said his will and desire was agreeable  
to the words in the memorandum & bid him <sup>be</sup> Witness thereof  
in the presence & hearing of the other two Witnesses and that  
the said Testator — at the same time was to the  
best of their apprehension of sound and disposing mind  
and memory —
