

The speaker of the house of representatives receives 12 dollars, and each member of either house the sum of six dollars for every day's attendance in Congress: and at the commencement and end of every session six dollars for every twenty miles distant by the shortest road, between the seat of government and their respective habitations. The secretary of the senate and clerk of the house of representatives, have each an annual salary of 1500 dollars, and two dollars per day during the session.

After the 4th. of March 1795, the members of the senate will receive seven dollars per day.

The chaplains of each house are allowed at the rate of 500 dollars per annum. The Serjeant at arms of the house of representatives has four dollars per day during the session. The door keepers have each 500 dollars; and the assistant door keepers 450 dollars per annum.
