The allowances in the two cases last mentioned are to be divided, three eighths to the owners of the vessels, and five eighths to the fishermen employed therein the preceding season, in such proportion as the quantity of fish by them respectively taken shall bear to the the whole quantity taken on board such vessels during the said season—

Besides the above specified drawbacks and allowances, which entitle the exporter, &c. to the receipt of money, there are fundry other allowances, which tend to diminish the duty to the importer, &c.
