Jones's Town Entries

- X December 27. 1736 M^r William Tell having neglected to build upon the
N^o 8 two Lots in Jones's Town (within the time limited by Act of Assembly)
9 N^o 8 and 9 for which he desires to have the said two Lots N^o 8 and 9
reentered in his own Name and for his own use and his Heirs
- X December 31. 1736. Then came Doct^r Buckler Partridge and desired
N^o 11 the Lott N^o 11 in Jones's Town might be entered for himself and his
Heirs, which accordingly is now done
- X July 2. 1737 Then came Doct^r Buckler Partridge and represented that
whereas Thomas Matthews having neglected to comply with the requisit^e
N^o 10 mentioned in the Act of Assembly his Right to the Lott N^o 10 in
Jones's Town falls, and is rendered null, therefore the said Partridge
desires ~~that~~ the said Lott may be entered in his own name, which
now is accordingly done
- X August 30. 1737 Then came M^r Thomas Taylor of Baltimore County
N^o 12 and took up the Lott N^o 12 in Jones's Town, and desired it might be
registered in his own Name and for his use, which is now accordingly
done
- X August 30. 1737 Then George Walker took up in his own name and for
N^o 13 his own use and his Heirs the Lott N^o 13 in Jones's Town, and
registered the same
- X March 20. 1737/8 Then M^r William Tell ordered the Lott N^o 16 in
N^o 16 Jones's Town which he had formerly (viz. on the 21st September 1736) taken
up, to be Registered in his name and for his use which accordingly
now is done
- X June 6. 1738 Then George Walker Clerk of Jones's Town (having
N^o 20 neglected to build upon the Lott N^o 20 according to Act of Assembly)
desires that the said Lott N^o 20. may be registered in his own Name, and
accordingly it is this day done
- X N^o 13. June 20. 1738 Then George Walker sold all his Right Title and Interest
of in and to the Lott N^o 13 in Jones's Town in Baltimore County
unto Redman Dearing, and now it is Registered in his own Name and
for his own use
