1784. in this state, the property whereof in whole or in part shall be owned by or belonging to any person or persons not being a citizen or citizens of the United States, or the territories thereunto belonging, over and besides the duties of tonnage heretofore charged upon all ships and vessels coming into or going out of the said ports, which said additional duties shall be accounted, taken and paid in the like manner in all respects, and under the like penalties for refusal or neglect, as in and by the before recited act, entitled "An Act for appointing Wardens for the Port of Philadelphia, and for other purposes therein mentioned," are directed and expressed.

In case of disability, &c. directions for appointment.

SECT. XXVI. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if any of the said Wardens shall refuse to act, remove from the port of Philadelphia, be rendered incapable of acting, or die, that then and in such case, the President or Vice President in Council for the time being, shall appoint a Warden or Wardens, in the room, stead and place of such Warden or Wardens who shall so refuse to act, remove, be incapacitated or die, and in case of the refusal, removal, incapacitation or death of the Collector of Tonnage by this act appointed, then the Wardens aforesaid, or a majority of them shall in the recess of the Assembly, nominate and appoint a Collector in the room, stead and place of the said Collector who shall refuse to act, remove from the port of Philadelphia, be incapacitated or die, and as often as a refusal to act, removal, incapacity or death of any Collector under this act shall take place; which Collector shall, during the recess aforesaid, exercise all the authorities and jurisdiction under this act appointed, to be by him exercised or done in the appointment aforesaid.
