Dear Mr. Fowler:

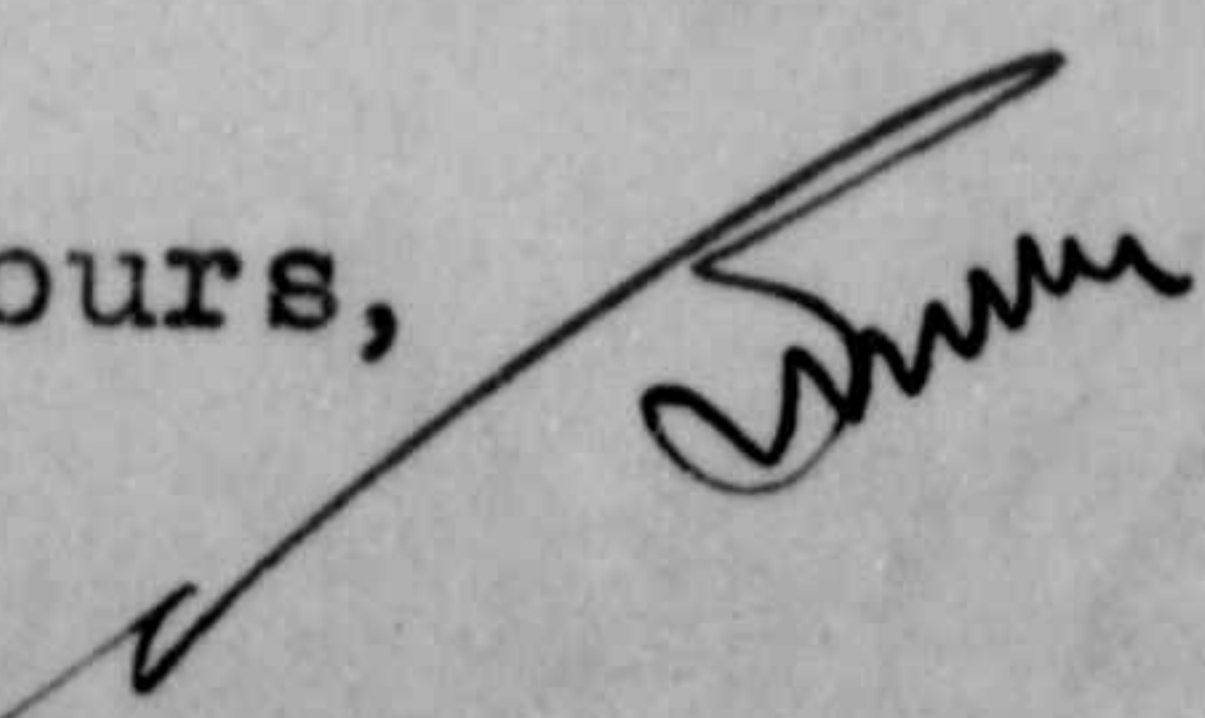
