HISTORICAL DATA:

Painted inscription over entrance door in the vestibule:

"STATE Department of Education
Building erected 1694
1695-1837 used by Governor and Council
1837-1903 used by State Treasurer."

Bronze tablet on the exterior wall:

"THE OLD TREASURY

Built during the term of Sir Francis Nicholson
Provincial Governor of Maryland 1694-1699
Used as the place of meeting for the Governor's
Council as a Provincial Court Room and as the
Treasury of the Colony and of the State of
Maryland.

This tablet is placed by the

Peggy Stewart Tea Party Chapter
Daughters of the
American Revolution
Maryland Day March 25, 1930."

The measurements of this building were
given to the Maryland HISTORIC AMERICAN BUILDINGS SURVEY
by Mr. H. G. Hall, Architect of Baltimore, who made them
in 1934, and the drawings except one were donated by
Wyatt and Nolting, Architects, of Baltimore.
