Three original doors, with their locks and huge keys of steel, are to be found as originally erected. Iron bars are to be found over the windows, but they were not put there to render the building safe from the attack of Indians, as seems to be the belief of many Annapolitans, but they were probably put in place at the time the State Treasurer's Office was moved there. One small room was converted into a vault by increasing the thickness of its walls and interweaving into it old wagon tires, sword blades and scrap iron -- this also was, in all probability, done at the time the State Treasurer's Office was moved there.
