IN CARROLL COUNTY, MARYLAND,

At the time of the adoption of the Constitution of Maryland, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-four, made by the Commissioner of Slave Statistics for Carroll County, in pursuance of an Act of Assembly of Maryland, passed January Session, 1867.

Luther Welsh Owner of the Slaves enumerated and described in this Statement at the time of the adoption of the Constitution of 1864.

Thompson* and *Sam^l Thompson* and did make oath in due form of law, that they have no interest whatever in the Slaves named in this Table, nor are they in any manner interested in this proceeding, and that the several matters and things as above stated and set forth are true to the best of their knowledge and belief.
