I, the undersigned, being a resident of the County of Carroll, State of Maryland, do hereby certify that on this the 29th day of January, 1869, I personally appeared before me, the undersigned, and did make oath in due form of law that the owner of the slaves as above named at the time of the adoption of the Constitution in 1788, and that all other matters and things as above stated are true to the best of my knowledge and belief; also at the same time and place personally appeared before me, the undersigned, and did make oath in due form of law that they have no interest whatever in the slaves named in this Table, nor are they in any manner interested in the proceedings, and that the several matters and things as above stated are true to the best of their knowledge and belief.
