The Reports of the districts were received and examined.

Thompson Field No 51 Exeter Street was appointed a policeman in the Middle district in place of George M. Seach dismissed

Charges against officer Pentz for going in M. Ways Store - Eastern district and drinking whiskey to intoxication, were examined the evidence failed to prove the charge and the officer was honorably acquitted.

Charge against officer No 45 Water. & C. charged by Henry Bartz - with pushing him off the pavement and trying to prevent his voting. Bartz failed to appear at the appointed hour and the case was dismissed.

Charges similar to the above were preferred against officer Ramsay. Western district. by P. C. Eschback - for abusing him on election day, case examined and the charge not being sustained the officer was acquitted

The charges against officers G. W. Bodensick, C. Stone, P. Upperman and Thomas Garrison, made by Sergt. Cadwalader, for insubordination, were not sustained by the evidence and the case dismissed.

The charges against officers D. Burman, D. H. England, William D. Ramsay, J. Bramble and D. Hamilton, for insubordination, were, upon examination sustained and the officers were dismissed the Service.
