The reports were received from the districts & examined
Charges against officer James P. Wright, Middle
district, were not sustained and the case dismissed

Charges against officer W. Miller of Middle Dist,
were not sustained and the case dismissed.

Charges against officer Jacob Houck, West Dist
were taken up and in part sustained and the
officer ordered to be reprimanded.

Charges against officer Pat. Sheldon, South Dist,
were examined but not sustained - case dismissed

Baltimore Jan'y 4th - 1867.

Board of Police Commissioners

Gentlemen: I beg leave to make the following
Report in reference to increasing the Police force on
certain streets and would suggest.

1st That 6 men be appointed to patrol Baltimore
Street in the day time from High St to Howard St

The first two to take both sides of Baltimore St.
from High to Gay St. 2^d from Gay to Saint Paul
St - 3^d from Saint Paul's to Howard St.

2^d Appoint one man to patrol Lombard
St from South to Charles St.

3^d Appoint two men to patrol Pratt Street
from the Bridge to Charles St.

The Beats binding on these streets I think
had better remain as they are, and let the men
attend to them instead of remaining @ portion
of each rounds on these streets as they have been
doing heretofore.
