To the Commissioners of Finance  
Gentlemen;

I am instructed by the Board of Police  
to say to you that the City Register has informed  
the Board that he will be unable in the future to  
furnish the funds necessary to meet the demands of  
this department

They are therefore reluctantly compelled to  
ask you to furnish the amount required to meet  
their obligations, which will be from fourteen -  
to fifteen thousand dollars every two weeks, until  
the 1<sup>st</sup> of May next.

They will need for their first payment Thursday  
the 14<sup>th</sup> Inst - fourteen thousand five hundred dollars

You will please inform the Board at your  
earliest convenience, if you can comply with  
their request
