The Police Commissioners hereby give notice that it is their purpose to conform strictly to the recent law of the General Assembly of Md. passed March 8<sup>th</sup> 1867 creating a new Police force for Baltimore City.

We will therefore receive applications for position and appointments in the force at the office of the Board (Folliday St) and there only, commencing on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1867 and every day thereafter, (Saturday and Sunday excepted) between the hours of 10 A.M. and 1 P.M.; the party applying must present his application in person and in his own hand writing.

We would ask the assistance of those Citizens who feel interested in the peace and prosperity of Baltimore to aid us in securing a force that will command the public approbation.
