In regard to the bad examples set to the Force by Officers bringing whiskey into the Station House and then drinking the same, together with the fact of the frequency of their visits to Whitehall, thus openly and defiantly violating Section 10 of the Tenure Regulations, the Board would state that they deem such conduct very reprehensible and cannot be too severe in characterizing the conduct of these men as calculated to demoralize and disgrace the force, impair its efficiency and bring it into general bad repute.

For the above described offenses, they have decided to fine
