Trials.

CHARGE.

Officer Thomas McGrain, Northern District, was tried upon, found guilty of the following charge and fined \$10.00, and warned that if found guilty of a similar offense in the future he might expect to be dismissed from the force.

CHARGE.

"Being under the influence of liquor coming off duty 7.10 P.M., September 26, 1902."

Turnkey Charles H. Sinclair, Western District, was tried upon, found guilty of the following charge and fined \$2.00

CHARGE.

"Neglect of duty, by carelessly allowing Alfred McCray, c, a sentenced prisoner, to escape from his custody, from the Western Police Station, at 9.25 A.M., On Sept. 26, 1902."
