

Baltimore, Wednesday, October 1, 1902.

Hogan and Officer Hobbs, Northwestern District, be permitted to retain twenty-five dollars donated to them by John A. Denton, Ellicott City, Md., for the arrest and conviction of Charles Clay and Joseph F. Jay, charged with assault &c., upon J. Milton Denton, December 31, 1901

Assignment of Magistrates.

The Secretary reported that on September 30, 1902, Justice Daniel J. Loden, Western District, had notified the Department he wished to be absent from his duties from 8 A.M., October 1, until 8 A.M., October 3, 1902, and that he, the Secretary, had assigned Additional Justice Neilson Poe, Jr., to sit in the place of Justice Loden during his absence.

The action of the Secretary, as above, was approved.
