It was ordered that the Marshal be directed to ascertain, if possible, the names of the boys referred to and any others who may have knowledge of violation of the liquor law on the part of keeper of said Hotel Iwonder, and to report the said keeper to the Grand Jury if he finds sufficient evidence to justify such a course.
