

Trial.

CHARGE:-

"Having been one hour and twenty-five minutes behind the return of his squad 4.20 A.M., October 26, 1902; having been asleep on his post while on active duty October 26, 1902."

McKenny White was assigned to sit in the Juvenile Court during the absence of Magistrate Heuisler, as above, and Justice William Reed was assigned to sit at the Northern District Station-house from 3 P.M., to-day, until relieved, in the place of Justice White assigned to the Juvenile Court, as mentioned.
