Retirement of Sergeant  
Clarence Walmsley, Central District.

A report was received from the Police Physicians of the result of their examination of Sergeant Clarence Walmsley, Central District, who the Board directed to be examined, as referred to in the proceedings of December 5, 1902, the said report stating that Sergeant Clarence Walmsley was permanently disabled by reason of an injury received by him in the discharge of his duty, June 30, 1891, and that he is unfit for active police duty.

The Board thereupon ordered by the following vote, that Sergeant Clarence Walmsley, Central District, be retired on one-half pay; said retirement to date from January 1, 1903.
