Assignments of Magistrates.

The secretary reported to the Board that Justice William J. Robertson, Southern District had notified the department February 24th, 1903, that he desired to be absent from his duties from 3 P.M., February 24th, 1903 to 8 A.M. February 26th, 1903, on account of sickness; that he the secretary, assigned Justice Charles H. Revioll to sit at the Southern District Station-house from 3 P.M., February 24th, 1903, until relieved in the place of Justice Robertson, Additional Justice Nelson Poe, Jr., having been assigned to the Northern District.
